
Gy Salvevold made motion to post Policy 3-05-107 Removal of Students during School Day. Ron Larsen seconded motion. Motion carries unanimously.





B. Our boiler inspection this fall yielded some disparaging comments from the inspector. With recent tube leaks and other problems that will be forthcoming from the age of our boiler, the inspector recommended to Steve that we begin the process of looking into a replacement. Scobey (propane) and Plentywood (electric) have both replaced their respective boilers in the past two years. I plan to go to those schools in the upcoming month with Mike, Steve, and Lora to visit with their administration and staff about their experiences with both propane and electric boilers. We could also look to remain with coal, depending on the cost to repair/replace the current boiler. As a rule coal is a fairly low cost means of heating the building, but it is very labor intensive from October through April each year. In all to say, there will be a lot for the Board to consider as we move forward. I look forward to having a full report to the Board on our findings on or before the December Board meeting.

- C. On the economic front, the tax revenue for oil is down in the first two quarters compared to last year. In addition our Impact Aid revenue is also down from last year. This all is leaning toward the potential need to borrow the remaining \$600,000 for the building loan that the voters approved, but we did not pursue initially.
- D. Since our last Board meeting the Annual TEAMS (Accreditation) Report was completed. In addition, the Federal Carl Perkins Application, Federal ESEA Application, and the Federal IDEA Application were completed. The National Civic Rights Data Collection will be sending us a report for the 2015-2016 school year in the near future that we will need to complete.
- E. The MHSA Annual Meeting will be held on January 16th in Great Falls. Please let me know if you would like to attend this event by the middle of December so that I can make the proper travel arrangements.
- F. The legislative session will begin in January and the makeup of the state house, senate, and governor's office is virtually the same as it was in 2015. State revenues are down, so it looks like education will be lucky to come out of the session merely hanging on to the current funding levels.
- G. In the curriculum review cycle it is time for the District to begin the review process for the mathematics curriculum in all grades K-12. Paul, Cheryl, and Amanda are currently on the Curriculum Committee. Normally, the staff will complete the initial work on the curriculum review prior to having the Board committee meet. After the Board committee meets there will usually be a recommendation for the full Board at a meeting that will most likely be in the spring of the school year. Any and all changes to the curriculum generally go into effect in the next school year (2017-2018).

3-05-107. Removal of Students during School Day.

The Board recognizes its responsibility for the proper care of students during a school day. In accordance with District procedures, only a duly authorized person may remove a student from class, the school building, the school grounds, or school function during a school day. A person seeking to remove a student from school must present evidence satisfactory to the administrator of having proper authority to remove the student. A teacher should not excuse a student from class to confer with anyone, unless a request is approved by the administrator.

School personnel must exercise a high order of responsibility for the care of students while in school. The removal of a student during the school day may be authorized in accordance with the following procedures:

- 1. Law enforcement officers, upon proper identification, may remove a student from school.
- 2. Any other agencies must have a written administrative or court order directing the District to give custody to them. However, employees of the Department of Health and Human Services may take custody of a student under provisions of 41-3-301 MCA without a court order. Proper identification is required before the student shall be released.
- 3. A student shall be released to the custodial parent. When in doubt as to custodial rights, school enrollment records must be relied upon, as the parents/guardians have the burden of furnishing schools with accurate, up-to-date information.
- 4. The school should always check with the custodial parent before releasing the student to any non-custodial adult.
- 5. Prior written authorization from the custodial parent/guardian is required before releasing a student into someone else's custody, unless an emergency situation justifies a waiver.
- 6. Law enforcement should be called if a visitor becomes disruptive or abusive.
