





B. Other items for your consideration:

- 1. The Montana Legislature has begun. Attached please find a copy of the bills that MTSBA is following.
- 2. I am currently working on the Eastern C Division Football Schedule for the 2019 season and hope to be done very soon.
- 3. The Civil Rights Data Collection has officially opened their website for our school to enter data from the 2017-2018 school year. This is an annual data collection from the Office of Civil Rights that all schools in our state (and I assume across the US) are required to submit. The deadline to complete the submission of data is April 22nd.
- 4. The Impact Aid Application was submitted prior to the January 31st deadline. We generally receive Impact Aid payments in October.
- 5. I am currently working with Mike on a K-12 staffing plan for the Board to consider. We hope to have this plan to the Board by the end of February. This plan will include how many elementary classrooms should be considered at each grade level, including how many teachers will need to retained/hired to make it possible. I will also be working on a short-term and long-term facility plan for the Board to consider. The facility plan should be completed by the end of March. This plan will include boiler replacement, Old Armory options, replacement of playground equipment, football field lighting, completion of the new elementary addition, additional security cameras, computer network upgrade, and many more items probably too numerous to mention.

- 6. The Title VI (Indian Education) Grant has three parts. Part 1 of the grant is due by March 7th. We utilize these funds to pay for the position that Tessa Rumsey currently holds. I submitted Part 1 of the grant application on February 13th.
- 7. I have been receiving phone calls and requests for visits from some of our area superintendents ranging from Glendive to Hinsdale. They are requesting advice and counsel from time to time. I have also received requests from Scobey and Ennis in the past month to share our Trimester Class Schedule.


