Visitors were recognized. Amanda Cullinan made motion to approve agenda. Cheryl Kirkaldie seconded motion. Motion carries unanimously. Notice for public comment given.

Amanda Cullinan made motion to approve the 2016-2017 school budgets as presented. Ron Larsen seconded motion. Motion carries unanimously.







# Malta High School Extracurricular Activities ImPACT Testing

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Malta High School is currently implementing an innovative program for our student-athletes. This program will assist physicians/athletic trainers in evaluating and treating head injuries (e.g., concussion). In order to better manage concussions sustained by our student-athletes, we have acquired a software tool called ImPACT (Immediate Post Concussion Assessment and Cognitive Testing). ImPACT is a computerized exam utilized in many professional, collegiate, and high school sports programs across the country to successfully diagnose and manage concussions. If an athlete is believed to have suffered a head injury during competition, ImPACT is used to help determine the severity of head injury and when the injury has fully healed.

The computerized exam is given to athletes before beginning athletic practice or competition. This non-invasive test is set up in "video-game" type format and takes about 20-30 minutes to complete. It is simple, and actually many athletes enjoy the challenge of taking the test. Essentially, the ImPACT test is a preseason physical of the brain. It tracks information such as memory, reaction time, speed, and concentration. It, however, is not an IQ test.

If a concussion is suspected, the athlete will be required to re-take the test. Both the preseason and post-injury test data is given to a doctor or mid-level provider to help evaluate the injury. The information gathered can also be shared with your family doctor. The test data will enable these health professionals to determine when return-to-play is appropriate and safe for the injured athlete. If an injury of this nature occurs to your child, you will be promptly contacted with all the details.

The ImPACT testing procedures are non-invasive, and they pose no risks to your student-athlete. The testing is required and free to all Malta High School student athletes. This program provide us the best available information for managing concussions and preventing potential brain damage that can occur with multiple concussions. The Malta High School administration and coaching staff are striving to keep your child's health and safety at the forefront of the student athletic experience.

Required baseline testing will occur previous to the start of fall practices on August 11 and 12. Sign-up through the high school office to reserve an appointment to test on the listed dates. Return the attached consent form with the appropriate signatures to the high school office. What Roosevelt County needs from Boards of School District 17, 64, & 65 is the right to fix this incorrectly described legal boundary, and file the corrected boundary description with the Clerk and Recorders Office in Wolf Point.

## Montana Code Annotated 2013

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- 13-3-103. Certification of boundary changes. (1) Not more than 10 days after an order of the governing body has established or changed the boundaries of an election precinct, the governing body shall ensure that a written legal description and a map showing the borders of all precincts and districts in which elections are held within the county are prepared and delivered to the election administrator.
- (2) Not more than 10 days after school district or other election district boundaries have been changed, the governing body making the change shall certify any changes or alterations in the boundaries to the election administrator and deliver a written legal description and a map showing boundaries of the wards, school districts, or other election districts. The map must be sufficiently detailed to clearly identify the wards or districts and the territory included in each.
